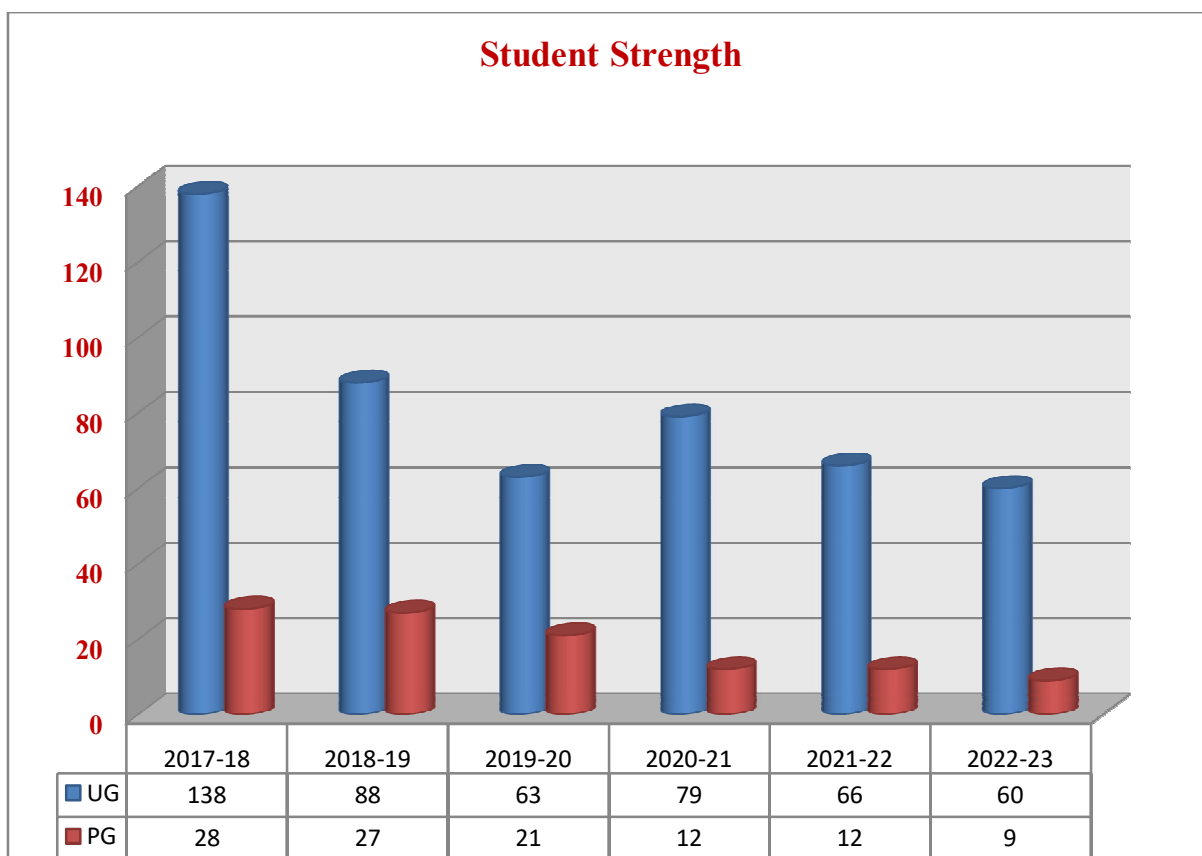

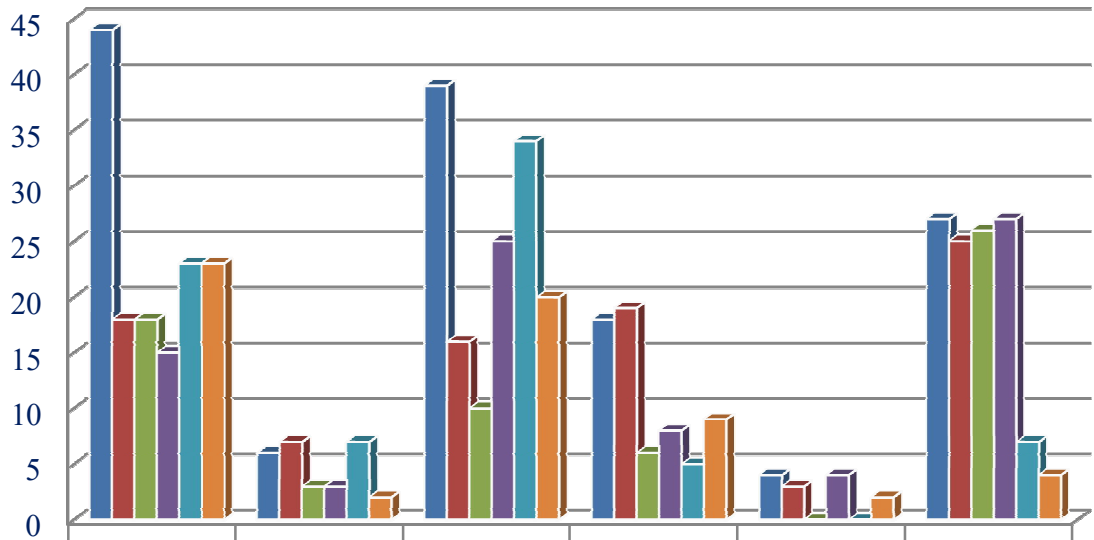

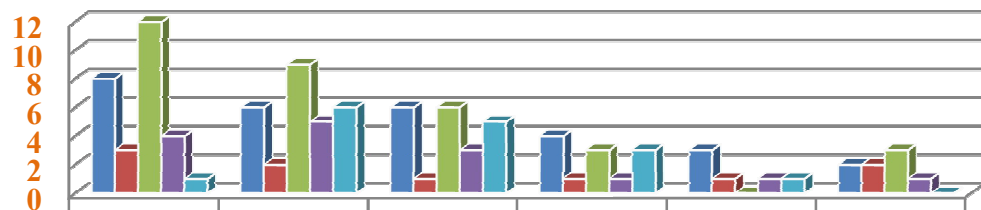


Category wise Analysis of Enrolled Student (UG)



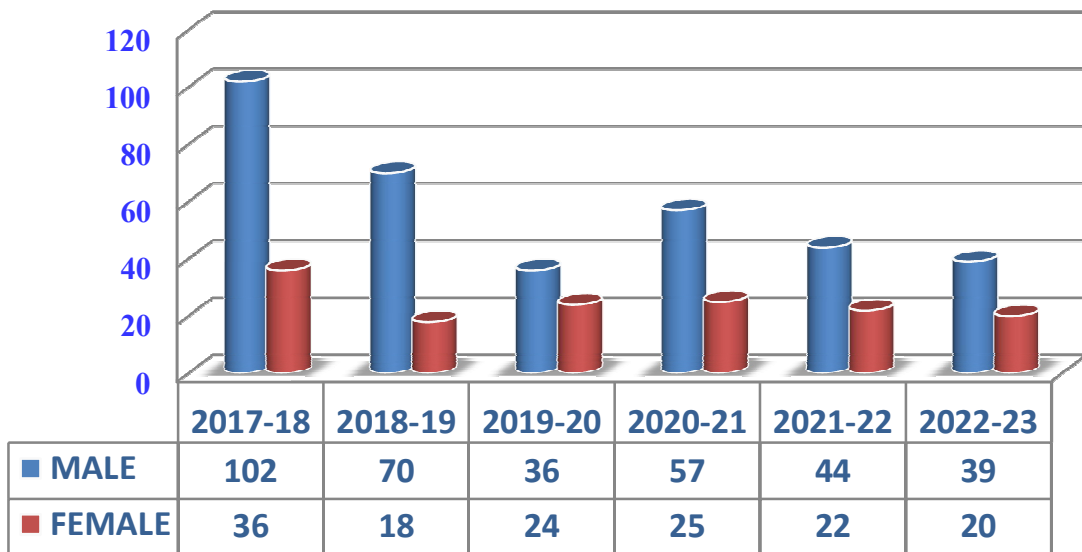

Category wise Analysis of Enrolled Student (PG)

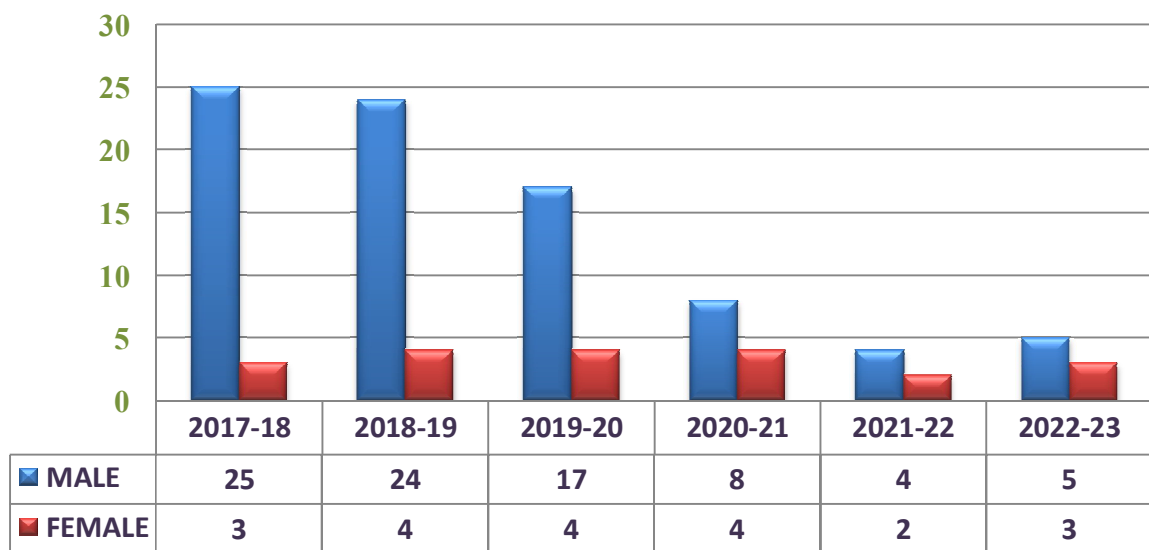
