1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Yeshwantrao Chavan Arts, Commerce and Science College, Ambajogai is one of the branches of M. S. P. Mandal Aurangabad. The institution at Ambajogai was established on 15 th June, 1972 and received UGC recognition under 2(f) 12(b) on 28th October, 1986. It is established to impart quality education to the students coming from weaker sections of the society from the rural area. From last 51 years, it has been continuously dedicated to sincere service of the society to lead it from darkness to light. It has remained most effective measure for the social change in awakening the society and sowing the seeds of humanity. Facing challenges and undergoing required changes from time to time, it has contributed to the core values of NAAC. It has contributed to national development, fostered global competencies among students, imparted value system among students, promoted the use of technology and created quest for excellence among the students and teachers. Taking into account the mission and vision of the institution, it has been marching ahead to meet the challenges of changing scenario of the education today.

The Institution runs UG, PG and Ph. D. programmes. There are 03 UG Programmes as Arts, Commerce and Science. There are 05 PG Programmes in the subject English, Hindi, Marathi, Political Science and Economics. The institution also runs PG Programmes in Commerce. There are 03 Research Centers in the subject English, Political Science and Economics. The institution has been rendering noble services in the field of Teaching, Learning, Research and Extension.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

The students benefited through the Certificate Courses from 2017-18 to 2021-22 are 131, 156, 163, 223, 279 respectively. The institution has introduced CBCS and Elective Courses pattern at UG and PG Level as per BAMU guidelines.

 The teaching learning and evaluation approach of the institution is student centric which is reflected through various teaching methods adopted by the teachers. The faculty makes effective use of ICT tools.
- The faculty pays special attention towards the slow learners for whom 'Remedial Coaching' is introduced by the institution. For the advanced learners, Guest Lecture Series, Honours and Awards are given by the faculty and the institution.
- Study Tour, Industry Visit, Field Visit, Research Projects, Wallpapers, Surveys, Seminars, Conferences, Workshops etc. are effectively implemented by the institution. Community Works, Skill Based Training Programme, Various Competitions, Students' Seminars & Group Discussions etc. takes place.

REMEDIAL COACHING FOR THE SLOW LEARNERS

1. TITLE OF THE PRACTICE:

Remedial Coaching for the Slow Learners

1. Objectives of the Practice:

Our college runs Arts, Commerce and Science faculties and receives students from rural area. These students are from 35% to the merit holders. We never discriminate the students and deny admissions on the basis of percentage as per the Motto, Mission and Vision of our institution as the institution is established for the education of the rural and backward students. Right from 1972, we have been rendering services to the society and providing means of bread and butter with self- respect. We are bound to educate and uplift the students and to bring them in the main stream of life.

The poor learners grasp the basic ideas through the remedial coaching.

- The slow learners slowly but confidently walk with the regular class and make a good progress.
- It is a little additional work but highly beneficial for the students to match with the advanced learners, regarding classroom teaching.
- Most of the students who were frightening to learn the subjects like English, Economics, Accountancy etc. are benefitted with this practice.

1. THE CONTEXT:

• Ours' is not the institution simply for earning money but servicing the society for uplifting them to the main stream of life. It is not the matter of sympathy but the matter of morality to devote for the noble social cause. Everybody should be well educated then and then only, we can survive happily, otherwise somebody will be weeping and it would not be possible for us to get sound sleep. To have real pleasures of life, one should not be denied from the right to get education which is the only means of making fair life. Our institution thoroughly thought about the necessity of the programmes like Bridge Course, Remedial Course and Values Added Certificate Courses to be introduced to the students to join the Graduation Courses. The institution does not demand admission fee from the students for these courses. For two times, our institution received university grants for this noble cause during the XIIth Plan. Later on, the committed faculty of our college decided to carry on the noble practice beneficial for the slow learners.

1. THE PRACTICE:

• Bridge Course to Remedial Coaching:

After the admission process, the lectures begin with the Bridge Course for the first year students as per the Time Table and well prepared Academic Calendar of the institution. The Bridge Course begins in the first week. One week lectures are given for Bridge Course during which, the faculty introduces the syllabus and basic concepts of the subject to the students. During that, the faculty realizes the diverse needs of the students. The class mixed with slow, medium and fast learners learn at different levels at which the teachers face communication barriers and list the slow learners for the next step of taking Remedial Coaching for them.

• Syllabus of Remedial Coaching:

The Remedial Coaching begins with the designed syllabus by the Departments.

• Time-Table of the Remedial Coaching:

The Remedial Coaching is specially designed in 30 lectures, as per the necessity of the subject. Without disturbing the regular teaching-learning, the new Time-Table after finishing the regular time-table is fixed.

1. EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS:

- Remedial Coaching of our institution really remained fruitful for the slow learners which raised their confidence to learn the subject like English, Mathematics, Economics, Physics etc.
- It is observed that the slow learners learn confidently with the class without hesitation.
- The Periodical Assessment of the students shows that they are slowly catching the speed and trying to cope with the regular class. Their Remedial Coaching results show a clear picture that they have learn what the remedial coaching had destined. The result of the classes remained fruitful and the students passed in the university examination.
- That somebody cares for us, is a big concern in the life of a human being, which is nicely realized by the slow learners. It is a great gain for the faculty that wins the reverence from the students. What more does the teacher really need? This is what our faculty has been enjoying the pleasures of Remedial Coaching every year.

1.PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED AND RESOURCES REQUIRED:

1. During the planning and implementation of Remedial Coaching, initially our faculty realized that the slow learners need to be treated separately. For that, the faculty discussed and decided the need

- of having Bridge Course and Remedial Course for such students.
- 2. The Time-Table of the college begins by 8.30 am. and ends by 5.00 pm. The time for the Remedial Coaching had also become difficulty but after the lectures of First Year students, one clock hour was expected to be taken.
- 3. Initially, the faculty thought that it would be additional work and it will give them additional financial assistance of UGC. Initially, it was granted by UGC under Merged Scheme. But, later on, the faculty realized that it is really a needed activity to enrich the Curriculum Learning on the part of all the students, may UGC provide Grants or not was also understood and the programme remained in use.

4. NOTES:

Now, no faculty takes it other-wise, whether it is supported by the finance or not. As a matter of moral responsibility, the faculty has supported this practice and this practice has become the Best Practice of the College.

1. Bridge Course, Remedial Course, Guest Lecture Series, Honours and Awards:

The students coming from various classes for graduation need to bridge to their university syllabus. The beginners are given bridge course and the slow learners are given remedial course. The students with sharp sensibility and ability to understand the syllabus are also given special treatment with mentor-mentee system. The intensive lecture series are also organized for the advanced learners. The advanced learners are also given honours and awards by the faculty.

1. Study Tours, Field Visit etc. :

The subjects like geography, science, commerce and even other subjects need experiential learning. The institution organizes study tours and field visits.

1. Project Writing:

B.A. T.Y. students have a paper of project writing for semester V and VI. It is evaluated through the external examiner as per the guidelines of the university.

1. Feedback from Students, Alumni, Teachers and Employers:

The feedback helps to understand the progress and short comings. The institution takes feedback from students, alumni, teachers and employers.

1. Placement Cell and its Activities:

The placement cell organizes campus interviews and training programmes every year.

 Various Competitions and Student Centred Activities are organized by the College as one of the Tools to Measure POs and PSOs.

Mentor Mentee

- Previously, our college had implemented class teacher concept for student mentoring.
- Later on, we decided to have subject wise mentoring, through which the Head of the Department gives class wise responsibility to the members of the department due to which things become easy

to handle.

- The faculty members keep record of roll lists, regular attendance, internal assessment, participation of the students in various activities, phone calling to the students and parents, discussion with the students about their difficulties, academic preparation for examination, financial problems regarding admission and examination fees, result analysis, discussion upon weaknesses, bridge coaching, remedial coaching, appreciation for achievements etc.
- The parents meet is organized so as to understand and convey the weakness and strength of the students to the parents and get their support to strengthen the mentoring activity.
- The students are provided strict academic disciplined learning.
- They are also given scope to raise their difficulties so as to solve them.
- The students having special interest in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities are given special attention. The concern teachers of those activities are given information about the special interest of the students towards the mentor.
- The students feel free to discuss their academic difficulties with the mentor and help the teaching, learning and evaluation atmosphere healthy.
- The office administration takes note of the mentoring system and gives suggestions and appreciations if necessary.
